McDonald's Restaurants of Canada:**

I am a Canadian consumer who cares greatly about the treatment of animals raised for food.

Right now, eggs used in McDonald's Canada food come from hens kept in battery cages – small wire cages where four or more birds are confined in a space the size of a microwave oven for their entire adult lives.

This is outrageous cruelty – so cruel in fact that Europe has banned battery cages as of 2012. Cages are also unnecessary as more and more egg producers are raising hens without cages.

As a global leader in the food industry, you have the opportunity to improve the quality of life for millions of hens whose eggs are used by McDonald's.

McDonald's has already begun buying cage-free eggs in Europe. In Canada, Burger King has made a commitment to buy cage-free eggs and so can you.

Please match the commitment by McDonald's in Europe and other fast-food restaurants by buying more eggs from suppliers who do not cage their hens.
